

From 1pm to 4pm we rehearsed two of Sir John's pieces and then tackled Part 1 of Haydn's *Creation*.

In addition, the cathedral's youth choirs sang Sir John's popular tunes to the hymns *All things bright and beautiful* and *For the beauty of the earth* and professional singers sang solo parts.

After a break, when I took the photo opportunity, it was back for more practice before the concert began at 7.00pm.

The sound of hundreds of voices all together was terrific and it was a truly great experience.

# Hundreds gather for mass baptism in the sea

**HUNDREDS** of people have taken part in an outdoor ser-

vice which saw 92 people baptised in the sea.

Congregations from five churches across Bournemouth gathered next to Boscombe Pier for the event.

Peter Baker, senior minister at Lansdowne Church, led the ceremony described as a celebration of faith.

He said the public display was to "bring together Christians who believe in Jesus Christ and want to tell the world that".

Mr Baker said the church was "alive and kicking" in Bournemouth and it had seen a "quiet revival" post Covid. He said it felt like a festival and the churches were planning to do similar events in the future for people who were "unashamed" of their faith.

Liam Brownen, (right), who



was baptised at the event in Bournemouth said the church had helped him to overcome his struggles with drug and alcohol addiction.

"The second I gave my life to Christ I was instantly relieved of the bondage of addiction," he said.

He added that the baptism "means everything to me. I owe my life to Christ so to be baptised in His name is unbelievable".

There is something reassuring, seeing it swinging in the breeze above our neighbourhood, symbolising as it does, the certainty of our Christian faith.


